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School Liaison Officer Welcome

Welcome to the start of a new school year. If you're new to the area, congratulations and welcome to Hampton Roads, home to more military families than anywhere else in the world. This area boasts over 68,000 military children from all branches of the service: Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine, and Coast Guard.

Hampton Roads is a superb place for families. In addition to great amenities and recreational facilities found on each installation, our location offers unlimited points of interest in the surrounding communities with local schools committed to providing a quality education for our families. As your School Liaison Officer, my role is to improve transitional support for school children of military personnel by establishing partnerships between the base and local schools, advocating for military children, increasing awareness of the unique needs of military children, and providing a process to address and resolve military specific issues affecting students in kindergarten through 12th grade.

There are two school systems serving Langley AFB. Main base housing residents attend Hampton City Schools, with 36 schools and approximately 23,000 students. For main base there are one elementary, one middle, and one high school serving as primary feeder schools. The nearby Bethel Manor housing area residents attend York County Schools, with 19 schools and approximately 13,000 students. Bethel Manor residents are serviced by two elementary, two middle and two high schools, depending on where you live in Bethel Manor.

There is one school system serving families who live on Fort Eustis--Newport News Public Schools, with 45 schools and approximately 33,000 students. General Stanford Elementary is located on Fort Eustis with a student population of approximately 600. Reservoir Middle School with approximately 550 students, and Woodside High School with approximately 2000 students, are located not far from the installation.

There are many opportunities to expand educational opportunities by applying to a Magnet school to further challenge the talents of your children—we encourage you to explore your options. For those living off the installation, there are opportunities for families to attend schools in nearby cities. There is also an extensive listing of private schools in the area for you to choose from.

We have a superb relationship with the school districts. Our commitment as a member of the surrounding school districts/communities is very strong—we will need your help to continue to expand this relationship to help improve our schools. Please consider volunteering in your children's schools. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the School directly. Once again, welcome to Hampton Roads!

GENERAL INFORMATION

New Student Registrations

Bring the following documents at the time of registration:

- Student's original certificate of birth or certified copy
- Record of immunization: See additional information below.
- Document of recent physical, within 1 year of date of entry: Virginia School Entrance Health Forms may be picked up at any school, or downloaded from the Virginia Dept of Education website:

- Legal proof of residence: Letter from housing, settlement or rental contract, utility bill, etc.
- Student's Social Security card
- IEP: Individual Education plan for student with special needs/disability (best if evaluations are current within past 12-months)
- Legal Documents: As needed (court custody, adoption, foster, etc...)
- Records from previous school: Or, the correct address for request of records. (recommend you hand carry records from previous school)

Please note that students entering Kindergarten must have reached their 5th birthday on or before 30 September of the year in which they enroll.

Immunizations

Upon entry or transfer into a school setting, documented proof of immunization is required, as listed below:

- Diphtheria, Tetanus, & Pertussis (DTaP or DTP) – Minimum of 3 doses. A child must have at least one dose of DTaP or DTP vaccine after the fourth birthday. DT (Diphtheria, Tetanus) vaccine is required for children who are medically exempt from the pertussis containing vaccine (DTap) or DTP). Adult Td is required for children 7 years of age and older who do not meet the minimum requirements for tetanus and diphtheria.
- Polio Vaccine – a minimum of 3 doses of polio vaccine with one dose administered after the fourth birthday. However, a child who has received four doses of polio vaccine before the fourth birthday is adequately immunized and does not need a dose after the fourth birthday.
- Measles, Mumps, & Rubella (MMR) – A minimum of 2 measles, 1 mumps, and 1 rubella. First dose must be administered on or after the 1st birthday. Second dose of measles vaccine does not have to be administered until age 4-6 years (usually at entry to kindergarten).
- Hib Vaccine – Influenza vaccine required only for children by 30 months of age administered as recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics.
- Hepatitis B: 3 doses required for all children born on and after 1 Jan 1994 (with at least four months spacing between the first and third doses).
- Varicella: All susceptible children born on or after 1 Jan 1997 will be required to have one dose of chicken pox vaccine not earlier than 12 months of age.

School/Bus Locator

Your address determines which elementary, middle, or high school your child will attend. You may locate your child's school by going to the school district website, clicking on school zone finder, and entering your address; or you may call the school district office. School district website addresses can be found at the end of this booklet.

All bus stops are based on student addresses provided by each school. If you do not find a bus stop, the district may not have the correct address. Contact your school to be sure they have the correct address on file including any day care addresses. If the address is incorrect, call your school district office.

Delayed Openings – Early Closure

The Superintendent of each school district makes the decision to close schools. After receiving information and recommendations from the Director of School Transportation, and considering the time and severity of the inclement weather, the Superintendent makes a decision no later than 0600 for schools to close, delay opening for 2 hours, or to open under regular schedule.

Hampton: Delayed opening decisions will be aired on cable channel 46, other television stations, posted on the school district website, and recorded on the HCS Infoline, 727-6789.

York County: Decisions will be aired on York County School Division (YCSD) TV, Channel 47, and other television stations. Messages will be recorded on 898-0300 or 898-0391 after 0600.

Newport News: The Superintendent makes the decision no later than 0600. Decisions will be aired on Newport News Public Schools (NNPS) TV, Channel 47, or call 283-7810.

Poquoson. Delayed opening and/or closure decisions will be aired on cable channel 48 (Cox) and 25 (Verizon), and posted on the school district website. In addition, parents are notified by telephone.

For all other cities, please check the school division's website for information on closings.

Parent Teacher Student Association (PTSA): You are encouraged to become active in your schools. All schools have PTSAs; contact your child's school to determine time/location:

Impact Aid: The mission of the Impact Aid Program is to disburse Impact Aid payments to local educational agencies that are financially burdened by federal activities and to provide technical assistance and support services to staff and other interested parties. At the beginning of each school year, your child's school will send home a federal survey card to be completed by a parent or guardian. Please complete and return this form. Since 1950, Congress has provided financial assistance to local school districts through the Impact Aid Program. Impact Aid was designed to assist local school districts that have lost property tax revenue due to the presence of tax-exempt Federal property, or that have experienced increased expenditures due to the enrollment of federally connected children.

Magnet Schools A Magnet Program is a specialized program in selected elementary, middle and high schools that focus on a particular discipline and requires participation in specialized courses, as an enhancement to the essential comprehensive curriculum. Magnet Programs

include: Math, Science, Technology, Communications, Fine Arts and others. Students typically must apply to attend, and admission is not guaranteed.

Standards Of Learning (SOL) Testing:

Virginia requires the mandated Standards of Learning (SOL) Tests, which VA developed to measure student progress, and to meet requirements of the No Child Left Behind Act. SOLs emphasize the importance of instruction in four core subjects: English, Math, Science, and History. All students, including Transfer Students, are required to take these tests in grades 3, 5, 8, and throughout High School. In High School, the number of tests required is determined by the kind of diploma (Advanced, Standard, and Modified). Beginning with the graduating class of 2003-2004, a student must pass a specific number of SOL tests in order to receive a VA Diploma.

The Virginia Board of Education will accept content-based high school end of course tests administered as a part of another state's accountability system for the purpose of awarding verified credit to students who transfer to Virginia public schools. When students transfer to a Virginia public school from a state that requires such high school end-of-course tests, the local school division may automatically accept the student's passing score on the test and the corresponding course for the purpose of awarding verified credit.

You may view your school's SOL tests results by visiting the School district or individual school website. Website addresses are at Appendix A. Also, the VA Department of Education website provides a "School Report Card" for each school in VA which includes information on SOL test results. Special Education

The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and Virginia's special education law require all schools to ensure that all identified children with disabilities have the right to a free, appropriate public education. Special Education and related services are provided at no cost to identified disabled students, ages 2-21. Services are available at each school for the diagnosis and remediation of learning difficulties. Begin the evaluation process with your zoned/base school. The majority of students eligible for special education services receive them in their base school. Students in need of more intensive services may receive them in a program outside the base school. First, contact your school principal; the Director of Special Education/Student Services, or the Special Education Advisory Committee are also good resources for additional information and referral procedures. Home Schooling

Parents may elect to participate in Home Instruction in a number of ways. All parents using either of the options below must complete and submit a Notice of Intent to Provide Home Instruction. Contact your school District office for appropriate forms; the Virginia Department of Education website also includes home instruction information for parents, available for download at the following website: <http://www.pen.k12.va.us/VDOE/Parents/homeinstr.pdf>

The Home Instruction Program options available to parents are:

- The teaching parent can have a Teaching License, High School Diploma; hold a baccalaureate degree or higher, from an accredited institution or none of the above and request written consideration. The parent may be asked to submit a program of study or curriculum with the notice of intent.
- Meet the qualifications for a teacher prescribed by the Board of Education. The parent may also be asked to submit a program of study or curriculum with the notice of intent.
- Enroll the child or children in a correspondence course approved by the Superintendent of Public Instruction. Evidence of enrollment must be submitted with notice of intent.
- Provide a program of study or curriculum which, in the judgment of the Division Superintendent, includes the Standards of Learning objectives adopted by the Board of Education for Language Arts (English) and Math and provide evidence that the parent is able to provide an adequate education for the child.

***ACCREDITATION**

*Virginia Department of Education School Accreditation ratings are based on student achievement on **Standards of Learning (SOL) tests in English, Math, History/Social Science, and Science**. Virginia requires these mandated Standards of Learning Tests, which VA developed to measure student progress, and to meet requirements of the No Child Left Behind Act. All students, including Transfer Students, are required to take these tests in grades 3, 5, 8, and throughout High School. In High School, the number of tests required is determined by the type of diploma (Advanced, Standard, Modified). Beginning with the graduating class of 2003-2004, a student must pass a specific number of SOL tests in order to receive a VA Diploma.

Beginning with the Spring 2004 testing cycle, schools are **Accredited or Accredited with Warning**. Provisional accreditation will no longer be conveyed to schools. High schools and middle schools are Fully Accredited if students achieve adjusted pass rate of 70% or above in all four content areas. Elementary schools are Fully Accredited if students achieve the following: a combined adjusted pass rate of at least 75% on English tests in grades 3 and 5, adjusted pass rate of at least 70% in Math, in grade 5 Science and History, and pass rates of at least 50% in grade 3 Science and History. A school is Accredited with Warning if it does not meet the requirements to be Fully Accredited.

****ADDITIONAL PROGRAMS** - Programs in addition to the traditional comprehensive curriculum. Schools also provide programs for Special Education needs. Please note that all districts offer traditional school activities such as athletics, cheerleading, clubs, and organizations, etc. Please contact your school district or individual school to obtain specific information on programs to meet the individual needs of your child. See general definitions below for the additional programs listed; the list is not all inclusive.

Magnet Programs / Specialty Programs - Programs in selected elementary, middle, and high schools that focus on a particular discipline and requires participation in specialized courses (for example: math, science, technology, communications, fine arts, and others). Students typically must apply to attend, and admission is not guaranteed.

Charter Schools – public schools that have flexibility in structuring their academic program and are bound by charter agreements granted by local school boards.

Fundamental Schools - Major emphasis on basic academic skills/subject matter and fostering good study habits.

Talented and Gifted (TAG) – Program for academically advanced students (intellectually gifted); selection for TAG is based on ability, academics, school performance, parent evaluation and other talents and skills. Students are evaluated to determine if they are eligible.

International Baccalaureate (IB) – An internationally recognized magnet program; offers rigorous and comprehensive pre-university course of study for 11th and 12th graders in selected schools. Designed to develop strong critical thinkers, and promote global awareness. Pre-IB for 9th and 10th grades is also available. Application to pre-IB and IB program is required; applications are available from guidance counselors.

COMMENTS/DEFINITIONS (cont'd)

New Horizons Center - Operates the following high school programs: Governor's school for Science and Technology, Career-Technical Education, Special Education, and Point Options/New Summits Program. The Center serves all four surrounding districts and two additional districts. Students attend classes on a time-shared basis with remaining classes taken at their home high school.

SENATE BILL NO. 1191: A BILL to amend and reenact § 22.1-5 of the Code of Virginia, relating to participation in interscholastic programs; students residing on a military or naval reservation.

1. That § 22.1-5 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:

§ 22.1-5. Regulations concerning admission of certain persons to schools; tuition charges.

A. Consistent with Article VIII, Section 1 of the Constitution of Virginia, no person may be charged tuition for admission or enrollment in the public schools of the Commonwealth, whether on a full-time or part-time basis, who meets the residency criteria set forth in § 22.1-3. No person of school age shall be charged tuition for enrollment in a general education development or alternative program offered as a regional or division wide initiative by the local school division in which such person is deemed to reside pursuant to § 22.1-3. Further, no person of school age shall be denied admission or charged tuition when (i) such person's custodial parent has been deployed outside the United States as a member of the Virginia National Guard or as a member of the United States Armed Forces armed forces; and (ii) such person's custodial parent has executed a Special Power of Attorney under Title 10, United States Code, § 1044b providing for the care of the person of school age by an individual who is defined as a parent in § 22.1-1 during the time of his deployment outside the United States. The person of school age shall be allowed to attend a school in the school division in which the individual providing for his care, pursuant to the Special Power of Attorney under Title 10, United States Code, § 1044b, resides. Furthermore, when practicable, such persons of school age may continue to attend school in the Virginia school division they attended immediately prior to the deployment and shall not be charged tuition for attending such division.

The following persons may, however, in the discretion of the school board of a school division and pursuant to regulations adopted by the school board, be admitted into the public schools of the division and may, in the discretion of the school board, be charged tuition:

1. Persons who reside within the school division but who are not of school age.
2. Persons of school age who are residents of the Commonwealth but who do not reside within the school division, except as provided in this section.
3. Persons of school age who are attending school in the school division pursuant to a foreign student exchange program approved by the school board.
4. Persons of school age who reside beyond the boundaries of the Commonwealth but near thereto in a state or the District of Columbia which grants the same privileges to residents of the Commonwealth.
5. Persons of school age who reside on a military or naval reservation located wholly or partly within the geographical boundaries of the school division and who are not domiciled residents of the Commonwealth of Virginia; however, no person of school age residing on a military or naval reservation located wholly or partly within the geographical boundaries of the school division may be charged tuition if federal funds provided under P.L. 874 of 1950, commonly known as Impact Aid, shall fund such students at not less than 50 percent of the total per capita cost of education, exclusive of capital outlay and debt service, for elementary or secondary pupils, as the case may be, of such school division. **Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, such persons of school age who reside on a military or naval reservation with military-owned housing located wholly or partly within the geographical boundaries of multiple school divisions shall be deemed eligible for interscholastic programs immediately upon enrollment in a public elementary or secondary school in any of the aforementioned school divisions.**

SENATE BILL NO. 1191(continued)

6. Persons of school age who, as domiciled residents of the Commonwealth who were enrolled in a public school within the school division, are required as a result of military or federal orders issued to their parents to relocate and reside on federal property in another state or the District of Columbia, if the school division subsequently enrolling such persons is contiguous to such state or District of Columbia.

7. Persons of school age who reside in the school division and who are enrolled in summer programs, exclusive of required remediation as provided in § 22.1-253.13:1, or in local initiatives or programs not required by the Standards of Quality or the Standards of Accreditation. For the purposes of determining the residency of persons described in subdivisions 1 and 2 of this subsection, local school boards shall adopt regulations consistent with the residency requirements regarding persons residing in housing or temporary shelter, or on property located in multiple jurisdictions, as articulated in § 22.1-3.

B. Persons of school age who are not residents of the Commonwealth but are living temporarily with persons residing within a school division may, in the discretion of the school board and pursuant to regulations adopted by it, be admitted to the public schools of the school division. Tuition shall be charged such persons.

C. No tuition charge authorized or required in this section shall exceed the total per capita cost of education, exclusive of capital outlay and debt service, for elementary or secondary pupils, as the case may be, of such school division and the actual, additional costs of any special education or gifted and talented program provided the pupil, except that if the tuition charge is payable by the school board of the school division of the pupil's residence pursuant to a contract entered into between the two school boards, the tuition charge shall be that fixed by such contract.

D. School boards may accept and provide programs for students for whom English is a second language who entered school in Virginia for the first time after reaching their twelfth birthday, and who have not reached 22 years of age on or before August 1 of the school year. No tuition shall be charged such students, if state funding is provided for such programs.
